Marco lowered his head over the caretaker's face, looking at his chest. He counted slowly and loudly

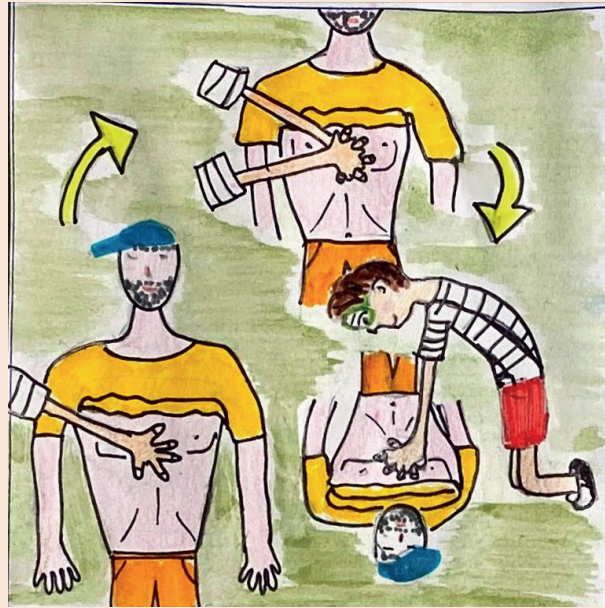
- "1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10".

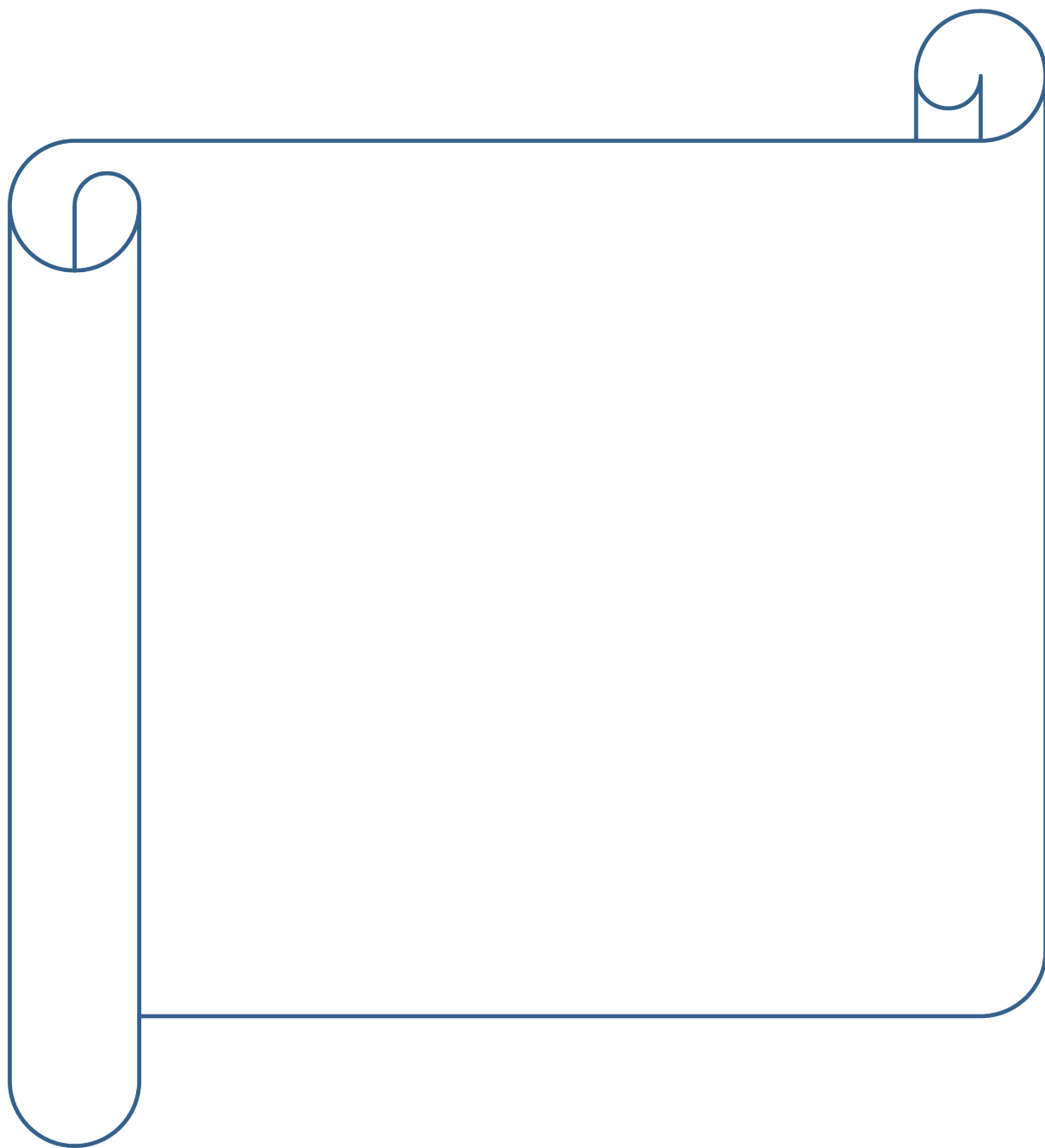

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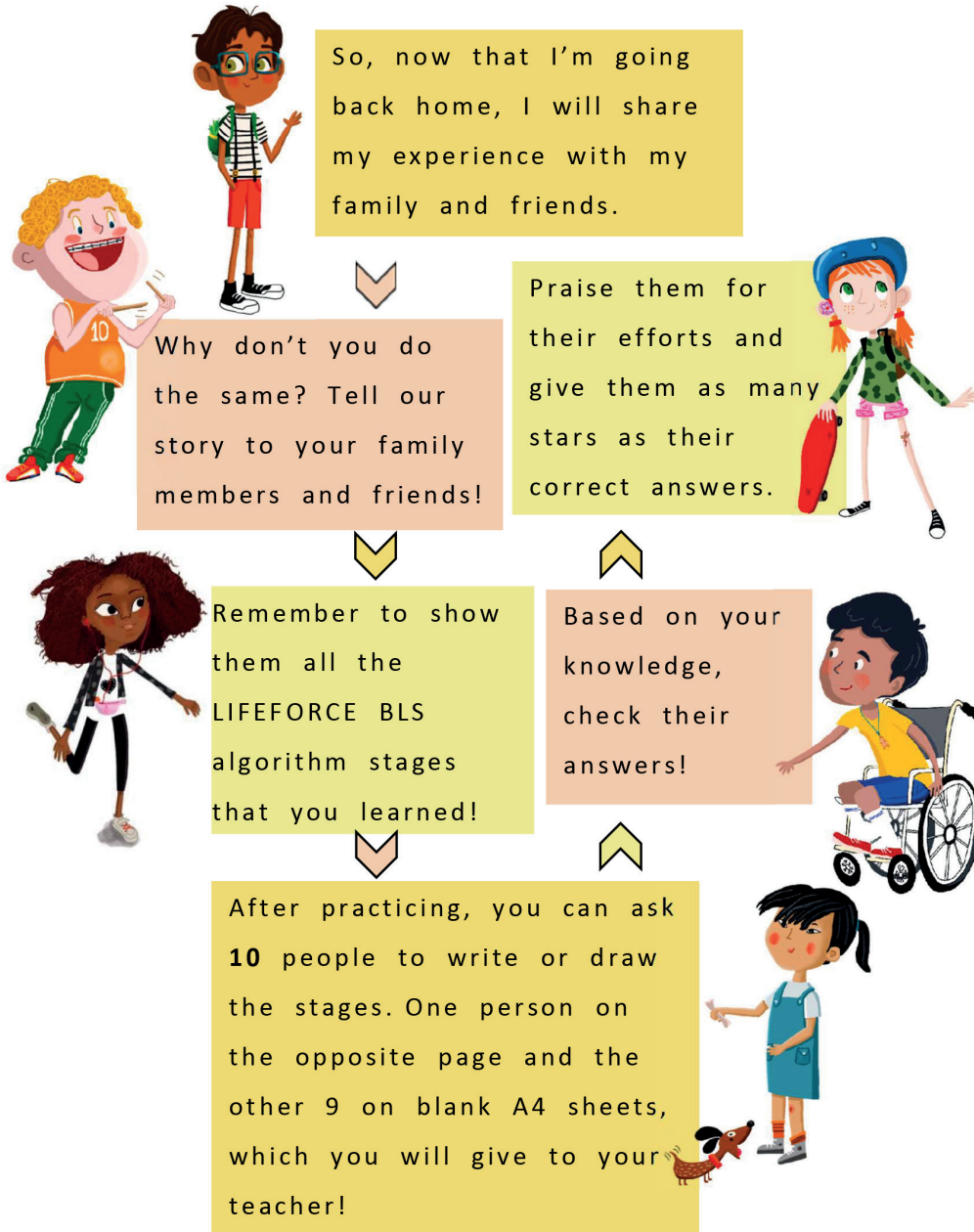
